BACK TO SCHOOL PARKING WOES

With the return to school has come the usual parking and pick-up confusion and confrontation that we have come to expect. Please remember that everyone is trying to pick up their kids all at the same time and it can get a little hectic.

The GREEN parking bays on Ledger Road is a 2 MINUTE PARKING ZONE. This is KISS AND DRIVE. If you are dropping your child off in the morning, this is the place to go. If you have asked them to meet you there in the afternoon, again, pull in, they should be waiting, once they are in you can drive off. It should all move smoothly as long as no one parks there.

If you need to park, there is bays along the school side on Huntley Street or the Community Centre is but a 150 metre walk to the school. I believe there is lots of free parking down there.

The Northern side of Ledger Road and the Western side of Huntley Street is NO PARKING. You can be fined by the City of Kalamunda for parking there. There is also a FIRE HYDRANT on Huntly Street that is often parked on top of. Please do not park here as in the case of emergency your car may come off second best if DFES need to access that Hydrant.

I am meeting with DOE and the City of Kalamunda to discuss options with regard to more parking. The previous proposal to extend the parking in Huntley Street has been abandoned due to lack of community support so it is back to the drawing board. Hopefully we will come up with a solution very soon. As I have said before, there is parking and pickup issues at every school. We just need everyone to be a little patient and remember that when you break a parking law, what message are you sending to your children.

BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

A reminder at this time of the year that we need to be vigilant when it comes to bushfire season and be well prepared in that case of an emergency. The school has a comprehensive Bushfire Emergency Procedure and drills will be conducted to ensure staff and students are aware of the Emergency Evacuation Procedures.

In the event of a day of Catastrophic Fire Danger, the school will be CLOSED.

Prior to the day of closure, SMS Messages will be sent to all parents' mobile phone numbers registered with the school and formal, written notification will be sent home to each family.

Announcements will also be made in the media.

School Closure signs and banners will be posted at all entrances to the school and on fences on Ledger Road and Huntley Street.

Children must not attend school.

LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL AND EARLY LEAVERS YEAR 1 - 6

A reminder if arriving after 9:15am, students are asked to sign in at the front office. They will be given a late slip and this will be automatically recorded on the attendance system. Students arriving before 9:15 can report to the classroom where they will be recorded in the late book.

Parents signing students out need to get a sign out slip from the office *before* collecting students from the classroom. They will then be able to give this slip to the classroom teacher as a record of signing the student out.

This is in-line with Education Department Policy on student attendance. Students in Kindy and Pre-Primary can still be dropped and collected from their classrooms where it is

recorded by the classroom teachers.

We are going to try and focus on reducing the use of soft plastics at school and would love all our families to help us.

CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Thank you to the parents who have already paid their Contributions for 2019. As previously mentioned this money supplements our funding allocation from the Department of Education and goes toward the provision of resources that extend the school's capacity to add value to your child's learning experiences.

The voluntary contribution of \$60 is for students from Kindergarten to Year 6. A Mathletics Subsidy of \$10 is also collected for students from Pre Primary to Year 6.

In addition to this parents are asked to pay for various excursions throughout the year such as In Term Swimming, Sculptures by the Sea, Sports excursions etc. These can be paid for as each excursion occurs or this year parents have been offered the option to make an "up front" payment so as to avoid having to handle multiple cash or direct debit payments throughout the year. This is entirely voluntary and parents are more than welcome to pay as each note is sent home.

If you are interested in the prepaid option, the estimate of costs is Pre Primary to Year 4 \$90 and Year 5 and Year 6 \$140. (This is in addition to the \$60 contribution). This payment does include the cost for In-Term Swimming. The Year 6 prepayment does not include any Graduation activities such as leavers jumpers or camp. We have an electronic billing system which allows us to allocate this money to each relevant item as it occurs.

If there is any money left over at the end of the year parents will be offered the option of a refund or of carrying it over to the following year.
